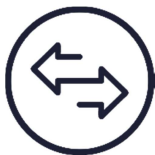

SUBJECTS AUTHORIZED TO PROCESS AND POSSIBLE RECIPIENTS

Your personal data are processed by internal staff who have been authorized and designated as persons authorized to process the data, and who have been given appropriate instructions regarding measures and modus operandi.



LEGAL BASIS AND PURPOSE OF PROCESSING

Personal data will be processed for the institutional and research purposes related to the performance of the IFVM2027 project; the legal basis for the processing is Article 6(1) (b) and (e) of the GDPR.

In detail, the data subject gives his/her consent for one or more of the following specific purposes:

- to manage the abstracts of the person concerned for the event IFVM2027



TYPES OF DATA PROCESSED AND METHODS OF PROCESSING

The processed data are as follows:

1. common data (name, surname),
2. contact details (e-mail address),
3. data relating to the professional profile (Institution),

In accordance with the principles indicated in Article 5 of the GDPR and, in any case, in such a way as to guarantee their security and protect the utmost confidentiality

of the data subject, the collected personal data are processed lawfully, correctly and pertinently. Only data necessary to achieve the purposes of processing are collected and they are stored for only as long as is necessary to achieve the purposes for which they were collected (see below).

The method of data storage is IT based. All data will be stored at IBF's registered office (Genoa, Italy).

STORAGE



Data required to register for the event will be stored until end of the event itself and then deleted.

DATA TRANSFER



Personal data shall not be communicated or disclosed to third parties in any way or for any reason whatsoever without informing the person concerned and obtaining their consent in advance, where required. Personal data will not be transferred to other countries (EU and non-EU) or international organizations.

RIGHTS OF THE PERSONS CONCERNED



With regards to the processing of personal data, the data subject has the right to:

1. access data, check them and request their update or correction,
2. withdraw, at any time, the consent to the processing of data previously given,
3. object to the processing of their data if this is done on a legal basis other than the consent previously given, including the processing of data for commercial, marketing and profiling purposes,
4. request the restriction of the processing of their data: in this case, the holder will not process the data for any other purpose than to keep them,
5. obtain the deletion or removal of their personal data, if the conditions provided for in Article 17 of the GDPR apply,
6. receive their data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and, where technically feasible, have them transferred to another data controller,
7. lodge a complaint with the competent data protection supervisory authority or take legal action.
